William Thomas Mackie, the son of John Mackie and Elizabeth Jane Edwards, was born 17 Sept 1870 St. Vincent Twp., Grey Co., Ont. and died 3 Nov. 1944 Nashville, Tenn. Buried in Mount Olivet Cemetery, Nashville.

Married Tennessee Alice Keller, daughter of Joseph W. C. Keller and Elizabeth Ann Couch, 21 Sept 1898 Nashville, Tenn.

She was born 2 Feb 1867 Bedford Co., Tenn. And died 30 Mar 1911, Nashville, Tenn. Buried in Mount Olivet Cemetery, Nashville.

Attended the Nashville Bible School 1897-98 and 1898-99.

The Mackies were a leading family in the Meaford church:

Meaford has had the excellent labors of the late B. Franklin, Eaton, Sheppard, Elmore and many others stretching on for many years. It is now a strong church and possessed of a band of fine workers. I may mention Layton, Law, Whitelaw, Sinclair, Mackie, Jas. Stirling, sen., etc., and principal women not a few. . . .

The church in Euphrasia, situated eight miles from Meaford . . . Since then they have been assisted by bros. Trout, who is in charge of the Commercial Department of the Bible School, came with his wife and child the last of September. From the city of St. Catharines we have Brother Ellis Claus, and from Carman, Manitoba, we have Brothers Stanley York and Norman Mallory. With Brother Whitfield, who has been here two terms, and Brother Mackie, we make up a fair representation from that part of the continent.

The 1910 Davidson Co., Tennessee census lists W. T. Mackie as a fruit farmer and the 1920 census lists occupation as general farming.

Yes, Tennessee Alice Keller and William Thomas Mackie were married on 21 Sep 1898 in Nashville. W. T. was my grandfather, he emigrated from Canada in 1895 and became an U.S. citizen in 1904. He was born in St. Vincent Twp, Grey Co., Ontario, Canada on 17 Sep. 1870, died 3 Nov. 1944, Nashville. Son of John Mackie and Elizabeth Jane Edwards both born in Canada.
